LESSON PLAN: INTRODUCTION.

Denotation: the dictionary and literal meaning of a word. Connotation: the emotional / contextual / cultural meaning attached to a word; shades and degrees of meaning. EXAMPLES: 1.

Home, House, Residence, Dwelling.

Denotation: These words all mean a place in which someone lives.

Connotation:

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1) Denotation: the literal dictionary definition of a word. Denotations are characterized by a neutral, objective tone. For example, thin and skinny have similar denotations. They each describe a quality of depth or size. 2)

Connotation: the meaning, association, or emotion that has come to be attached to a word. A connotation

Word Choice (Denotation and Connotation)

Connotations and denotations are the two basic ways through which the meaning of words is described.

Connotations refer to the feelings, either positive or negative, that are associated with a word due to the common practice of its use. On the other hand, denotations are the actual meanings or words.
